

### WHAT MT MERU COFFEE PROJECT HAS ACCOMPLISHED

#### **FAMILY INCOME:**

Additional Income to farm families is over \$2 million to approximately 2200 farm families since 1999. This is an area where typical family income is \$500 per year.

#### SUSTAINABILITY:

Many subsistence farmers have continued growing coffee and a number of farms have begun specializing in coffee growing. When the Project began many farmers were uprooting their coffee plants because of the low price then paid by the international coffee buyers.

#### **FARMER ASSISTANCE:**

Two MMCP full time project managers work with the coffee farmers to ensure the high quality of their coffee. The coffee purchased by Mt Meru Coffee Project is regularly ranked as PREMIUM.

#### MMCP TRUCKS:

With the help of individuals and congregations Mt Meru Coffee Project has purchased 2 trucks to be used by our project managers to monitor coffee growing practices by our farmers and the 5 cooperatives that process our coffee,

#### CONGREGATIONAL SUPPORT:

Meru Diocese congregations and other churches have experienced an increase in contributions. Churches are often the source for community support programs in Tanzania.

#### **EDUCATION:**

More children of farm families are attending secondary school – Tanzania Government pays very little for students older than 12.

#### **HEALTH CARE:**

More health care is now being accessed in the Meru Diocese. There is no health insurance in Tanzania.

#### CONGREGATIONAL SUPPORT IN AMERICA:

Congregations of the Greater Milwaukee Synod and beyond have ambassadors and narthex displays that enable members to purchase Mt Meru Coffee.
