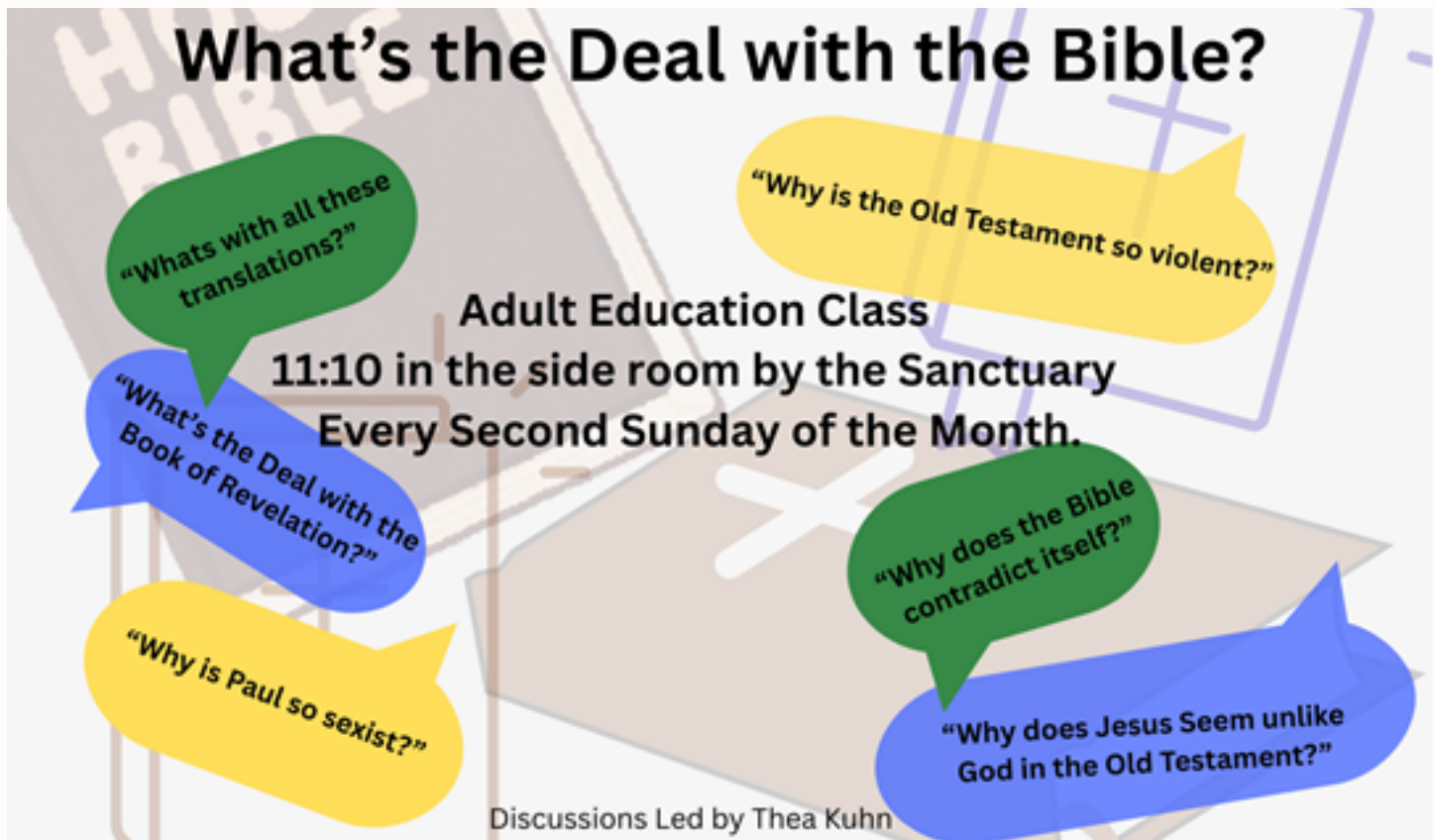

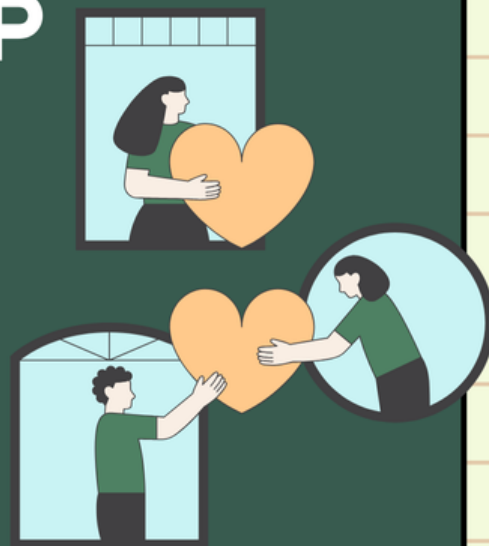

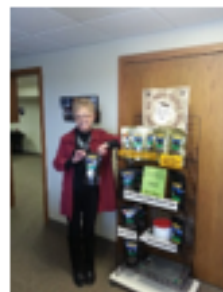

BECOME A MT MERU COFFEE PROJECT EMISSARY



You can be a part of this successful international outreach program that was established in the Greater Milwaukee Synod 25 years ago and has been improving the standard of living in the Meru Diocese in Tanzania ever since. You can do this right here at All Saints and have a good time doing it. By tending the Mt Meru Coffee narthex display for a few minutes after service and then offering packaged PREMIUM coffee to members during coffee hour you can make members aware of this program. You can also give them the opportunity to purchase PREMIUM coffee that has been grown with great care by small farmers in our partner synod in Tanzania. Typical annual income of farm families in the Meru Diocese is \$500.

Our new Ambassadors, Jacqui and Robi Lawson, are overseeing the Project at All Saints are hoping enough Emissaries will step forward to receive information that will make this duty worthwhile and fun. SONGORO – ALL SAINTS PARTNERSHIP



IMPACT IN SONGORO

COLLEGE EDUCATION

25 college students have been supported financially by patrons from All Saints. The percentage of people with college educations in Songoro is now far greater than in other communities in Tanzania.

SECONDARY SCHOOL EDUCATION

Most young people – including girls – now attend secondary school (high school). This was not true before our partnership was formed. This is not true of other congregations of sustenance farmers.

HEALTH CARE

Songoro residents are now able to access health care at the American Clinic of Songoro rather than walking more than one hour to receive health care at Nkoranga. This has saved lives in Songoro.

SOCIAL WELFARE PROGRAMS

Contributions at Songoro Lutheran Church have increased dramatically. The congregation is now able to offer social welfare programs not offered by the government. These programs include: elder care, child care, and vocational training. Scholarship recipients agree to support their congregation with the increased income they receive because of their education.

ELECTRICAL SERVICE

Many homes in the Songoro region now have electrical service that did not have it before our partnership. Electrical service in Songoro homes has increased from 5% in 2005 to 90% in 2023. It is presumed that the Tanzania Rural Electrification Program determines the areas to be provided with electrical service by the ability of residents in an area to pay for monthly electrical consumption.
