



As bishops of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), we write to you in this moment of national and global tension with clarity and conviction. Our faith compels us to stand where Jesus stands—with and for those whom society often seeks to exclude, erase, or diminish.



Scholarship Report from Songoro

The current report from <u>Songoro</u> Lutheran Church in Tanzania is displayed at our <u>Songoro</u> <u>Partnership</u> narthex <u>display</u>. A list of scholarship fund recipients is included. The partnership committee in Tanzania is familiar with those in need of assistance to remain in secondary school and grants the amount needed by each family for their student to remain in school. Typical annual income for the farm families of the Meru Diocese is \$500. School fees at government schools are \$70 - \$80. Private school fees at public schools, that are far more worthwhile, are \$250 - \$350. Scholarship funds are granted to students to remain in school with the remainder paid by their families.
