## Music Groups at All Saints

We have three music groups that regularly enhance our worship services at All Saints... bell choir, vocal choir, and ensemble. We thought we would give you a deeper knowledge of the two directors (Jean Voelkel and Lori Dittmar) who lead those groups in this "Spotlight" article. These choirs take the summer off, during which there is music provided by individuals or others that want to form an ad hoc small group.

**Jean Voelkel** is retired from teaching, and is a wife, mother, and now... new grandma! She leads the bell choir, getting an extraordinary sound out of this group. She has a long history with All Saints as one of its original members.

In Jean's words... "I joined the Bethel Handbell Choir after college & learned how to ring with this group. Jeff, Ben, & I watched our church being built & attended the first church service in this new building. The atmosphere was ELECTRIC, and everyone was so friendly that we decided to join right away. The first group we joined was the choir!"



I started ringing with the Bell Choir in the second year we had the bells. When our bell director left, Pastor Paul Stumme Diers asked me if I would like to direct. I had never done anything like this but agreed to try it for six months. Well, that was over 20 years ago. I am grateful Pastor Paul gave me that nudge because I love leading this group!

We ring with 12 positions. Some of our players travel/ have other commitments so we are fortunate to have an extra person or two to fill in when needed. **If anyone is interested in becoming a substitute, please let me know! Reading music is the only requirement for this group. We practice every Wednesday evening, except for the summer months.**

For me, music is a connection to God, ourselves, and others. It is his voice, his message, that can be very personal or shared with others. Music helps me be present in our worship services. It is how God speaks to me and through me. Being part of a church musical group is not about perfection (even though we all want to do our best) but rather sharing and being present with the message. And of course, fellowship!"

**Lori Dittmar** leads the ensemble and the vocal choir. She has been working with us for the past year and has done an amazing job. Lori is a very busy woman, as the Associate Principal of Kettle Moraine High School, and has a 14-year-old son. Lori's Master's degree is in Educational Leadership and Administration; however, her bachelor's is in Music (and flute was and still is her instrument of choice). In Lori's words... "Music has been in my soul for as long as I can remember. I was involved in as many ensembles as possible in middle and high school. I was a music teacher and band director for 14 years before becoming a principal. I've played in professional ensembles, including one which performed at Carnegie Hall. When I officially joined my first church, I also became their choir director. I served in that role for about 5 years before moving away from that area.

I think music is important anywhere! It is a medium that takes no experience or special talent to enjoy. At All Saints, our music groups allow friends of all ages and abilities to come together and worship together, sharing Christ's message in a meaningful way.

The time commitment for choir is one hour per week and one Sunday performance a month. It's an hour to join your friends, challenge yourself, and produce beautiful music! There are no "tryouts" for the choir. The Ensemble is a smaller group, where individuals are invited to sing. The Ensemble rehearses monthly and performs the Sunday following rehearsal. I know there are people that would like to be involved in more music groups -- with enough interest, we may be able to start a women's group!"

# A Christmas Message from Bishop Erickson



THIS ADVENT SEASON OF WAITING, WATCHING, AND HOPING TOOK ON NEW MEANING FOR ME THIS YEAR, AS I UNDERWENT KNEE REPLACEMENT SURGERY THE DAY BEFORE THANKSGIVING. I HAVE BEEN WAITING AND WATCHING AND HOPING THAT MY KNEE WOULD STRENGTHEN AND I WOULD SOON BE ABLE TO RESUME MY NORMAL ACTIVITIES. OF COURSE, THIS WAS NOT A PASSIVE WAITING, AS I HAD EXERCISES TO DO AND THERAPY SESSIONS TO ATTEND, AND I NEEDED TO PAY ATTENTION TO MY BODY AS I SLOWLY BECAME MORE AND MORE MOBILE.

WHATEVER IT IS THAT WE MAY BE WAITING AND WATCHING AND HOPING FOR THIS SEASON, I INVITE US TO REMEMBER THAT GOD WANTS TO PARTNER WITH US IN THE RESTORATION OF CREATION, AND THAT THE PEACE ON EARTH PROMISED BY THE ANGELS WILL ONLY COME IF WE ROLL UP OUR SLEEVES AND GET TO WORK.

I WAS RECENTLY INVITED TO PARTICIPATE IN A PODCAST THAT HIGHLIGHTED THE THEMES OF PEACE AND JUSTICE AND HOPE IN VARIOUS CHRISTMAS CAROLS. WE CONCLUDED THE CONVERSATION WITH THE CAROL "I HEARD THE BELLS ON CHRISTMAS DAY," WHICH IS AN ARRANGEMENT OF A POEM WRITTEN BY HENRY WADSWORTH LONGFELLOW IN THE MIDST OF THE CIVIL WAR. IN THE MIDST OF A STRING OF PERSONAL TRAGEDIES AND THE DEATH AND DESTRUCTION OF THE WAR, HE RECALLED HEARING CHURCH BELLS RINGING ON CHRISTMAS DAY. AS HE REFLECTED ON THE CENTRAL MESSAGE OF CHRISTMAS OF PEACE ON EARTH, GOOD WILL TO ALL, HE WROTE:

AND IN DESPAIR I BOWED MY HEAD;  
"THERE IS NO PEACE ON EARTH," I SAID;  
    FOR HATE IS STRONG,  
    AND MOCKS THE SONG  
    OF PEACE ON EARTH, GOOD-WILL TO MEN!"  
THEN PEAMED THE BELLS MORE LOUD AND DEEP:  
    GOD IS NOT DEAD, NOR DOETH HE SLEEP;  
    THE WRONG SHALL FAIL,  
    THE RIGHT PREVAIL,  
    WITH PEACE ON EARTH, GOOD-WILL TO MEN."



I AM MINDFUL OF ONE OF MY FAVORITE QUOTES FROM THE REV. DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., THAT "THE MORAL ARC OF THE UNIVERSE BENDS TOWARD JUSTICE." I HAVE COME TO BELIEVE THAT, WHILE THIS IS TRUE, IT DOESN'T BEND BY ITSELF. WE ALL NEED TO PARTICIPATE IN THE HARD AND HOLY WORK OF BUILDING THE RELATIONSHIPS AND NETWORKS THAT HELP BEND THE ARC OF THE UNIVERSE TOWARD THE VISION OF PEACE AND JUSTICE AND MERCY THAT GOD HAS ALWAYS INTENDED FOR CREATION.

## **WONDERFUL YEAR END CONTRIBUTION**

### **SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM FOR SECONDARY SCHOOL STUDENTS NEEDS YOUR SUPPORT**

The scholarship program that has been keeping most of the Songoro youth in school is not as well funded this year as it has been in the past. This is a proactive program that is improving the standard of living for today's members of our partner congregation as well as tomorrow's generations. The Tanzania government only pays for education for students until the age of twelve. Students past that age must pay school fees that are not realistic for most of the families of the Songoro Parish. The fees state secondary schools are approximately \$70.00 per year. The fees for private schools are \$250 - \$350. Students educated at private schools are more likely to obtain meaningful employment or possibly even higher education. Any size contribution is appreciated and will help.

Many young people without secondary school education wind up in city slums and resort to petty theft or prostitution. It is not possible for all young people to remain on the 1-3 acre family subsistence farms with annual family incomes of approximately \$500.

The Songoro Scholarship Program is not as well funded as it has been past years. It will be difficult for the Scholarship Committee in Songoro to inform some of the students that they will not be able to attend school this year. Songoro Scholarship Program envelopes are available at the Mt Meru Coffee Project display in the narthex and in the pews. You can change a life by supporting this program.
