


Cookie Walk

This is a non-profit organization that provides “a 12-24 month restorative care home in Waukesha County that provides mental, physical, emotional, relational and spiritual healing for women” who have been victims of sex trafficking and exploitation. Last year, because of Cookie Walk sales, we were able to send \$423.00 to Redeem and Restore. 

IMPACT IN SONGORO

COLLEGE EDUCATION

25 college students have been supported financially by patrons from All Saints.

SECONDARY SCHOOL EDUCATION

55-75 students per year are supported financially by the All Saints Scholarship Program.

HEALTH CARE

Songoro residents are now able to access health care at the American Clinic of Songoro rather than walking more than one hour to receive health care. All Saint contributions helped build the clinic.

Contributions at Songoro Lutheran Church have increased dramatically due to the increased income of scholarship recipients. The congregation is now able to offer social welfare programs.
